Our School Buildings

The original Victorian building consists of one main classroom, library, learning mentor area, office, toilets and staffroom. This part of the school has been extensively remodelled and refurbished over the last few years. In addition to this there are two demountable classrooms, a hall and an outdoor classroom. The hall is used for collective worship, dinners, PE, drama, dance, the teaching of specialist groups, extra curricular activities and out-of-school activities. Both sites can be hired for community use in the evenings and are currently used for ICT and yoga evening classes. The reception/Year 1 class has an outdoor shelter attached, play area, a large play house and an outdoor run for guinea pigs.



We have an extensive grounds to the rear of the main buildings, with a play field and areas set aside for gardening and three class coppices to create wild-life areas and areas of shade. The grounds are used as part of our work on learning to care for
